Achievements

Leadership:

2013-2015: As the acting lead for Neuroradiology, I had worked with leads from intervention and body teams as well as the then service lead to ensure timely appraisals for all Consultants, workforce planning and regular input into Departmental upgrade projects (CT and MRI).

2014-2017: As Medical Information Officer, I did a lot of ground work for testing and selecting the EPR and VNA systems for the Trust. The role involved meeting up with key stakeholders to develop the IT Strategy of the Trust with the then Medical Director, Dr Martin Elliott. In 2017 I gave up the role as I needed to focus all my energy on a strained and stressed Neuroradiology service.

2016-2019: Ensured that the Neuroradiology unit continued to deliver its services at a high level of quality and safety at a very difficult period for the team. I led by example, by reporting record volumes of cases, at a high level of accuracy and safety, and continued to provide leadership to several multidisciplinary team meetings. None of the services were stopped. I also assisted the management team actively in terms of recruiting a world class staff into Neuroradiology deriving talent from various parts of the world.

2016-current: As one of the Consultant project leads for the intra-operative MRI project, I have been involved actively right from the start in terms of the scoping, project planning and business case development.

2018-current: Took up the audit lead position at GOSH. Worked along with the Professional Lead for Radiographers to roll out an effective annual audit plan, established an annual Radiology Audit Award to motivate staff members to participate more actively, and also actively assisted the Department in gaining its ISAS re-accreditation in this cycle by reviewing the ISAS submission as well as creating a platform for future documentation of all evidence of good Clinical Governance.

2019: Set up the Neuroradiology Quality Improvement Team (N-QIT) at GOSH, chairing key stakeholder meetings with Consultant colleagues from Neuroradiology, Radiographers, Researchers from ICH and the Neurosurgical and Neurology leads. The team focusses on key deliverables- timely reporting, lean methodology for protocolling and scanner utilisation, ensuring effective and smooth roll out of the EPR, and further development of every domain of research and education. This has won a lot of appreciation from my colleagues.

2019: Set up the GOSH Radiology Artificial Intelligence Forum (GRAF) to encourage the Consultant body to come together and enable strong AI platforms while working with the DRIVE team.

2019: I am currently trying to establish a Master's programme in Paediatric Neuroradiology, in association with the UCL. This is hoped to roll out in 2020, and will be the first university affiliated degree of its kind in the world.
